Passage: Mark 4:35-41 (KJV)

35 And the same day, when the even was come, he saith unto them, Let us pass over unto the other side.

36 And when they had sent away the multitude, they took him even as he was in the ship. And there were also with him other little ships.

37 And there arose a great storm of wind, and the waves beat into the ship, so that it was now full.

38 And he was in the hinder part of the ship, asleep on a pillow: and they awake him, and say unto him, Master, carest thou not that we perish?

39 And he arose, and rebuked the wind, and said unto the sea, Peace, be still. And the wind ceased, and there was a great calm.

40 And he said unto them, Why are ye so fearful? how is it that ye have no faith?

41 And they feared exceedingly, and said one to another, What manner of man is this, that even the wind and the sea obey him?



HOMEWORK

Questions:

1. Reflect on verse 37. What storms or challenges are you currently facing in your life, and how do they compare to the storm described in this passage?
2. In verse 38, the disciples question Jesus' concern for their safety. Have you ever felt that God was not attentive to your struggles? How did you find reassurance in those times?
3. Jesus' command "Peace, be still" in verse 39 brought immediate calm to the storm. What steps can you take to invite Jesus' peace into your turbulent situations?
4. In verse 40, Jesus questions the disciples' faith. What are some ways you can strengthen your faith, especially during difficult times?
5. The disciples are amazed in verse 41 by Jesus' power over nature. How does this passage deepen your understanding of Jesus' authority and power? How can this impact your trust in Him?
